here does great chamber music come from? In Valley Classical Concerts' 2017-18 season, it comes from Mount Monadnock, the Pioneer Valley, the high Andes, Italy's "City of Violins," and, of course,

New York, St. Petersburg, Prague and Vienna. Best of all, it's accessible and affordable, presented in the comfort and acoustic splendor of Sweeney Concert Hall, and shared by like-minded friends, neighbors and fellow music lovers. Here's what's in store.

To find the group that opens our season on Saturday, October 21 (8 pm), we had only to look as far as southern New Hampshire and the acclaimed chamber music center from which the Apple Hill String Quartet takes its name. They bring with them Haydn, selections by Pelham, MA composer Geoffrey Hudson, and a quartet by Peruvian composer Celso Garrido-Lecca, whose music the quartet encountered while touring Peru under Apple Hill's "Playing for Peace" outreach program.

Also known for their avid outreach and adventurous programming, the Ying Quartet returns to the series after far too long an absence on Sunday, November 5 (3 pm). They'll have with them a very special guest: renowned pianist and composer Billy Childs, whose new quintet

"The River, the Bird, and the Storm" will highlight the program, along with quartets by Mozart (K. 421) and Dvořák (Op. 61).

Making their third VCC appearance on **Saturday, December 9** (8 pm) is one of our favorite

threesomes, the **Latitude 41 Trio**. And what a program: Haydn's "Gypsy" Trio, Shostakovich's precocious Trio No. 1, and that virtual Russian novel of a chamber work, Tchaikovsky's epic Trio in A Minor.

What would Super Bowl Sunday be without a great chamber concert to warm you up? This year, on **Sunday, February 4** (3 pm), we present one of the great names in American music, the **Manhattan String Quartet**, still at the top of their game in their 47th season, with quartets by Haydn, Witold Lutoslawski, and Ravel.

ince their scintillating VCC debut a few seasons ago, we've been awaiting the day when we could welcome the charming **Quartetto di Cremona** back to our stage. That day comes on **Saturday, March 31** (8 pm), when they serve up a four-course Italian program of Boccherini, Verdi, Puccini, and, rarest of all, the Quartet in D Major of Ottorino Respighi.

We've saved one of the best for last, on **Sunday, May 6** (3 pm). That's when the acclaimed young **Attacca Quartet** makes their VCC debut with one of the greatest of all quartets, Beethoven's sublime Quartet in A Minor, Op. 132. It will be preceded by Mendelssohn (Op. 12), and music by Pulitzer Prize-winner Caroline Shaw, who was in residence at Smith College during the Spring 2017 semester.

What could possibly follow? Nothing – until the 2018-19 season. Stay tuned!
