soul-satisfying afternoons and evenings of chamber music sure to please both classical connoisseur and total newbie.

The **Omer String Quartet** is living proof that string quartets are getting younger and better all the time. Possessing more first prize medals and ribbons than you can fit on a cello, the Omer will join us on **Sunday, October 6, 2019** to perform some charming early Schubert (Quartet No. 10 in E-flat Major), Czech composer Leoš Janáček's white-hot "Kreutzer Sonata" Quartet, and the first of Beethoven's profound "late" quartets, the Quartet in E-flat Major, Op. 127.





Ariel String Quartet

Making their third Valley Classical Concerts appearance on **Sunday**, **November 17, 2019**, the **Ariel String Quartet** has been making music together since they were middle school students in Israel 20 years ago. Now mentoring their own students while maintaining a busy concert schedule at major festivals

and concert series (including ours!), the Ariel will play a program of "Darkness and Light," including Haydn's "Quinten"

Quartet, Tan Dun's "Eight Colors" and Schubert's thrilling "Death and the Maiden" Quartet.

Lysander Piano Trio

A pair of stellar young piano trios (piano, violin and cello) will round out the season. First, on **Saturday, March 28, 2020**, the **Lysander Piano Trio**, formed at Juilliard in 2009, bring impressive individual skills to their interpretations of trio repertoire old and new. Their program, "Light and Matter," takes its name from a colorful work by Finnish composer Kaija Saariaho that shares the bill with a Nocturne by Scriabin and Piano Trios by Fauré and Schubert (E-flat Major, Op. 100).

Take the first name initials of its three members, each with an

accomplished solo career, and you get the **JCT Trio**, who conclude the VCC season on **Saturday, April 11, 2020**. And what a program: Haydn's "Gypsy" Trio, the very humorous and very serious Trio by rugged New England individualist Charles Ives, and the eloquent Trio in F Minor, Op. 65 by Antonín Dvořák.

Concerts take place at Sweeney Concert Hall, located inside Sage Hall, Green Street, Smith College, Northampton, Mass. The Saturday concerts begin at 8 p.m., the Sunday concerts at 3 p.m. And don't miss **Concert Conversations** one hour prior to each concert, when the musicians field questions from VCC's own master of ceremonies, John Montanari, as well as from you!
