alley Classical Concerts is thrilled to announce our 2025-26 season. We think it's a particularly exciting mix of the familiar and the not-so-much! All of our concerts will take place at **3:00** in the comfort and glorious sound of **Sweeney Hall** on the campus of our co-sponsor, **Smith College** in Northampton, Mass.

We open on **Sunday, October 12**, with the return of the **Harlem String Quartet**. A communicative ensemble of rare warmth, the Harlem brings a program of Beethoven (Quartet in A Major, Op. 18, No. 5), Britten (his ethereal Quartet No. 2), plus Pulitzer-winner Caroline Shaw's "Entr'acte" and Cuban conductor/composer Guido López-Gavilán's rhythmic "Cuarteto en Guaguancó."

On **Sunday, October 26**, one of the world's most exciting quartets, the **Quartetto di Cremona**, returns with a program of "Serenades," including Hugo Wolf's "Italian Serenade" and Ravel's amazing String Quartet in F Major. Eminent American clarinetist **David Shifrin** joins them for the autumnal Quintet for Clarinet and Strings by Johannes Brahms.

For a complete change of pace, **Sunday, November 16** brings the **Symphony Winds of Boston**. Six current or former woodwind soloists from the Boston Symphony: flutist **Elizabeth Klein**, oboist **John Ferillo**, clarinetist **Christopher Elchico**, bassoonists **Sam Watson** and **Rick Ranti**, and horn player **Rachel Childers** join Smith College pianist **Jiayan Sun** for a colorful program of Beethoven (Quintet for Piano and Winds, Op. 16), Hindemith (Kleine Kammermusik, op. 24, no. 2), German romantic Carl Reinecke (Trio for Piano, Clarinet and Horn, Op. 274) and Czech master Bohuslav Martinů (Sextet for Piano and Winds). Prepare to be astounded!

n Sunday, February 1, the impressive young Isidore String Quartet will appear. Winner of a

2023 Avery Fisher Career Grant and the 2022 Banff International String Quartet Competition, they will show their stuff in two romantic masterworks, Schubert's "Rosamunde" Quartet in A Minor and Brahms' Quartet No. 3 in B-flat Major, along with quartet arrangements of songs by Bach and Brahms.

French-Swiss cellist **Camille Thomas** arrives on **Saturday, March 7**, joined by the splendid pianist **Julien Brocal**. She is a Deutsche Grammophon recording artist who possesses "all the requisite technique and produces a sound I can only liken to drinking hot chocolate: delicious, warming, full of flavour" (Gramophone Magazine). Their varied program includes sonatas by J. S. Bach and Edvard Grieg, plus shorter pieces by Satie, Saint-Saëns, Brocal himself, and Radiohead.

And for a truly grand finale, on **Saturday, March 21**, the enterprising Boston-based chamber orchestra **A Far Cry** returns to our series with a wonderful program – American composer-performer Shelley Washington's "Middleground," Copland's Appalachian Spring in its delectable original chamber scoring, and Beethoven's Symphony No. 6, "Pastoral" in an arrangement for fourteen players – not to be missed!

One hour before each concert, we'll have "Concert Conversations" featuring the artists fielding questions from Artistic Director John Montanari and from you, our audience. We'll have lots of fun – so please join us!

e are thrilled with the success of our 2024-25 season. The ensembles were outstanding, while attendance matched and even surpassed pre-pandemic levels. The audience was wildly enthusiastic, and the musicians commented not only on our beautiful Sweeney Concert Hall, but on the warm reception they received. Any wonder that they want to come back? Could we be even more excited about next season?

Yet, a reality: Valley Classical Concerts could not function without the support of our patrons. We cannot rely on ticket sales alone. In fact, they cover only about 50% of the cost of each concert. Grants are increasingly difficult to obtain. We must find ways to continue to attract larger audiences. Artist fees have increased, as our musicians are subject to the same cost increases that plague the rest of us.

That's why we are counting on you to help sustain us. Your donation is an investment, not only in VCC's future, but in its present . . . you are a partner in what is happening on the stage.

We do our best to keep our prices affordable. Consider that in New York or Boston the same artists would cost two or three times what we ask. We discount heavily for students and admit 18 and under for free. We have no separate office and no paid staff... our work is done by volunteers. All our revenue goes back into the music. Your generosity makes a huge difference! Please help!
